4.3. Grading scheme and, if available, grade distribution guidance

Assessment of the acquired course material can be in general five-graded: excellent (5), good (4), satisfactory (3), pass (2), fail (1); three-graded: excellent (5), satisfactory (3), fail (1) (with the qualifications good, average, unsatisfactory). The fulfilment of the requirements of a course can also be certified with the teacher's signature. A student can obtain credits for a given course if he/she receives an assessment better than "fail". Assessment of the acquired course material can be in general - five-graded: excellent (5), good (4), satisfactory (3), pass (2), fail (1), - three-granded: excellent (5), satisfactory (3), fail (1)/ (with qualifications good, average, unsatisfactory). The fulfilment of requirements of a course unit can also be certified with signature (subscription). A student can attain a credit for a given course-unit, if he/she receives an assessment better than "fail" in that course-unit.
